

School Parent and Family Engagement Policy 2018/2019

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, Spectrum Academy receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy that contains information required by section 1116(b) and (c) of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). - Provide full opportunities, to the extent practicable, for the participation of parents with limited English proficiency, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children, including providing information and school reports required under Section 1111 of the ESSA in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request and, to the extent practicable, in a language parents understand.
- If the schoolwide program plan under Section 1114(b) of the ESSA is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, submit any parent comments on the plan when the school makes the plan available to the local educational agency.
- Be governed by the following statutory definition of parent and family engagement and will carry out programs, activities, and procedures in accordance with this definition:

Parent and Family Engagement means the participation of parents in regular, twoway, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring:

- (A) Parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning
- (B) Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school
- (C) Parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child
- (D) Other activities are carried out, such as those described in Section 1116 of the ESSA

JOINTLY DEVELOPED

Spectrum Academy will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

Parents are invited to participate on the Title 1 Committee which meets monthly in order to plan and discuss improvement. Parents are notified of this opportunity through informational flyers, back-to-school night, and Parent Empowerment Nights. For parents who wish to participate but cannot attend meetings, suggestions and feedback are encouraged electronically.

ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

Spectrum Academy will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact.

Spectrum Academy will hold an Annual Title I meeting to inform parents of the requirements of Title I and the school's participation as well as the parents' rights to be involved.

- The Annual Title 1 meeting will be held a minimum of two times prior to the start of each school year. One meeting to be held during the day and the other in the evening to accommodate all schedules.
- The Annual Title I meeting will not be used to ask for parent input, but provided as an
 opportunity to disseminate information and distribute copies of the revised parent and
 family engagement policy.
